REVIEW

Tim Keller: The main problem, then, in the Christian life is that we have not thought out the deep implications of the gospel, we have not "used" the gospel in and on all parts of our life... All of us, to some degree live around the truth of the gospel but do not "get" it. So the key to continual and deeper spiritual renewal and revival is the continual re-discovery of the gospel.¹

GOSPEL THIEVES

THIEF 1 - Moralism / Religion - we must obey in order to be saved/blessed.

THIEF 2 - Relativism / Irreligion - we are all accepted by God, and we decide what is true for us.

THIEF 3 - MY IDOLS: Jesus + X = Happy

The question is not if you have idols, it's in what particular order they matter to you.

- What am I adding to Jesus to be happy?
- How do I buy into the lies of the Evil One when I am tempted in my recurring sin?
- What good things am I using because I have an inordinate desire for something deeper?
- How would I rank the core idols (power, comfort, approval, control) in order of importance to me in this season of my life?
- How does the finished work of Jesus connect to my core idols today? What do I see Him losing so that I can rest and rejoice in Him whether I have my idols on earth or not?

OKAY, NOW WHAT?² THREE WAYS TO DEAL WITH MY IDOLS

- Moralizing Approach
 "Your problem is that what you're doing is wrong. Repent!"
 Emphasis: Behavior / Doing
- 2. Psychologizing Approach "Your problem is that you aren't experiencing that God loves you. Rejoice!"

Emphasis: Feelings / Being

3. Gospel Approach - Your basic problem is that you are looking to something in addition to Christ and have made it your source of true happiness. You have been worshipping an idol. Repent and rejoice that you may rest in the finished work of Christ for you!

The heroes celebrated by our culture are those who have discovered and authentically expressed their true self. The journey starts as we go inside to discover who we are. Once the true self is identified the community is expected to suppress their values in order to accept this true self.
