



Who is the best teacher you ever had? The best leader? The best mentor? No matter if you're thinking about a teacher, a coach, a pastor, a parent, a youth-group leader, or some other guide in your life, chances are that the person who sprung to mind when you read those first three questions did two key things: First, he or she brought you into their life in some significant way, and second they encouraged you to strive for something greater. To put it another way, the best teachers, leaders and mentors both invite us and challenge us. Both are necessary to truly help us grow. This is true for music teachers, volleyball coaches, dance instructors, and head chefs, and it's also true for people who disciple others to become followers of Jesus.

Challenge refers to an attitude that says, "I want you to grow, I'm committed to holding you accountable to change for the better."

When Jesus chose His Twelve Disciples He invited them into His life in a very special way, and also challenged them to live their lives for so much more. As we begin another new year, we continue to follow the model of Christ, striving to do all we can to encourage an empowered, discipleship culture at Our Father. If you are new, we want you to know you are invited to join us in our mission of helping ordinary people know and share extraordinary life in Christ!
