### The Executive Pastor and Our Father Lutheran Church

In January, Pastor Nate Peregoy stepped into a new role as Executive Pastor at Our Father. What's an executive pastor? Good question.

Consider the following Biblical leaders: Joseph and the Pharaoh, Aaron and Moses, Paul and Timothy. Each was given a unique role and a partner to share the responsibility of leadership in the story of God's people. As churches today grow in size, so too grows the need for specialization in the role of pastoral leadership. Although rare in congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, in Protestant churches across the country, the Executive Pastor (XP) has emerged as a critical position that complements the leadership of the Lead Pastor (LP) and maximizes the effectiveness of a congregation to do ministry in its local context.

The XP Today - Three Options:

- Overseer of Operations: This XP oversees all areas of operations, administration, finance, and human resources, but has little day-to-day involvement in the ministry of the congregation.
- Second in Charge: This XP oversees both ministry and operations and is empowered to lead in all areas of the church. XP's with this role may be found in a congregation where the LP is the main preaching voice, enabling him to focus on sermon preparation and vision casting.
- Ministry Strategist: This XP takes the vision of the LP and implements it with the key staff, directors and lay leaders. XP's with this role have a grasp of the vision, the steps needed to execute it and possess the leadership skills needed to work well with staff.

Role of the XP at OFLC - Ministry Strategist: The partnership between Pastor Abel and Pastor Peregoy and their complementary leadership gifts call for an XP who is most like the third option above. In sum, the XP provides leadership and oversight to all the ministry areas of OFLC. In this manner, Pastor Peregoy works directly with the ministry directors to implement the vision of OFLC in the three strategic environments for discipleship: We Gather in Worship (Matt Hoehne), We Grow in Faith (Cassie Schermbeck), and We Live God's Mission (Micah Steiner). As the Lead Pastor, Pastor Abel reports to the Parish Council, oversees both the ministry and operations of Our Father, and is able to leverage his time, influence, leadership and communication gifts for preaching and vision casting.

As Executive Pastor, Pastor Peregoy's duties include:

- Leading the ministry directors to maximize the effectiveness of each strategic environment.
- Working with Pastor Abel to improve congregational systems and complete new projects that enable effective ministry to flourish.
- Advising Pastor Abel in decision-making and planning.
- Regular preaching and teaching, including weekly Confirmation.
- Overseeing Care Ministry.
- Attending meetings of the Parish Council as a non-voting member in support of Pastor Abel.

With these two distinctive roles, Pastor Abel and Pastor Peregoy look forward to many years together as partners in ministry!

In accordance with our By-Laws, Parish Council Vice President Tammi Kotzker will assume the duties of the President and provide leadership as we move forward into an exciting fall ministry season. ### OFLC Transitioning to Fiscal Year Cycle

Our Father Lutheran will be transitioning its operating and accounting cycle from a calendar year to fiscal year cycle. The first complete fiscal year will begin July 1, 2019 and conclude June 30, 2020. Transitioning to this cycle aligns with the ministry year (events, liturgical calendar) and the preschool season.

### Organ Update

One of our 3 strategic areas at OFLC is **"We Gather in Worship"**. Recognizing the importance of this area in forming our **faith and growing us as God's children**, we are preparing to expand the organ to **better lead us in singing God's** praises. Taking on a project this size is a large task, but by breaking it into three phases makes it more manageable both financially and practically. It also allows us to move forward but remain flexible to future needs.

The first phase will address the pedal division, new console, and MIDI system. This gives us a firm foundation and prepares us for the next two phases. The second phase will address the great division (primarily used to accompany the congregation) while the third phase will address the swell division (used in accompanying instruments and choirs, and as a solo voice on the organ).

There is currently \$45,225.00 already in the Organ Fund. We anticipate that the cost of this first phase would be in the neighborhood of \$180,000. If you would like to contribute over and above your giving, you may do so by marking your **envelope with "Organ Fund."** Several of you have asked about giving a key, a pipe, a rank of pipes, etc. as had been part of a previous project. Watch for a form in the next few weeks that will give you that opportunity. More news to come as we begin this exciting project!
